


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A record year supporting young people, with record challenges

This year we delivered a record number of sessions to young people in our local area who need it most.


These record results however, come at a time of record referrals. We have been concerned about the rising numbers of referrals we are having for students at younger and younger ages, and have, as a result, expanded our work into primary schools.

In order to expand our work, we have been lucky enough to receive donations from Community Foundation for Surrey, KFC Foundation and Tesco. We also continue to recieve donations from many of you, for which we are incredibly grateful. These donations have supported us in expanding our work at a time where more and more young people are in need of support.

There is much work to be done, with more young people facing complex challenges everyday, but as we finish one school year and look into the next we are hopeful with what might be achieved.

Steady progress

This year (2023/24) we delivered 848 sessions. This was a 45% increase on the previous year (2022/23).

Since we began in 2021, we have delivered over 1980 sessions, increasing the number of sessions we provide annually by 383% since our founding.

Student experiences

92% of students would recommend Buddy Up to a friend

20% increase in students overall mental health from the start to the end of their time with Buddy Up mentoring

Over 98% of students feel their lives have improved because of Buddy Up

85% of students feel they have changed due to mentoring

9/10 was the average rating young people gave of their time with Buddy Up

Our gender split is approximately 60/40 in favour of males. with ages ranging from 10-16 years old.


Ethnicity
